RFP 23-5381 – Supply and Delivery of Wind Pumps and Technical Assistance for the Kiritimati Island Water Project.

Clarifications to questions:

Clarification 1

- The Cease of Manufacturing of Yellowtail Windmills The yellowtail production has been ceased; however, the spare parts are still available. There are predominantly Yellowtail wind pumps on Kiritimati and ideally, it is our preference to get another 10+ years of service out of them, hence the rehabilitation works required using available spares.
- Has there been any instances of tower failures caused by strong winds, given the location of Kiritimati? Would 4 post towers be preferable?
 With regards to the failures of towers, it can be confirmed that we have not experienced any issues on Kiritimati Island with the current 3-post towers structural integrity at high winds, however we would be open to consider 4-post options for the newbuild and future wind pumping options on the island. Please feel free to include the 4-post option on top of the 3-post option in the submission.
- Is there any preferred style of spare parts needed? For the new wind pump, we would welcome alternatives to the proposed Southern Cross wind pump set.
